History of the Judicial Reception

The Judicial Reception brings local judges and members of the Tallahassee legal community together in a social forum to mix and mingle while enjoying a delicious assortment of food and beverages. The first TWL Judicial Reception was launched at Forest Meadows Racquet Club on April 7, 1983 during Cathy Lannon's term as president. Linda Cargill Smith was the first Chair. In 1993, TWL expanded the honored guests to include DOAH judges and, in 1997, TWL adopted a policy of including the DOAH judges as honorees.

In 1986 the Judicial Reception moved to the 22nd Floor of the Capitol with more than 150 people in attendance. From

then until 2008, the host site alternated between the Capitol, the Museum of Florida History and the Mary Brogan Museum. Since 2008, the Judicial Reception has been held at Florida's Historic Capitol. Since its inception, the Judicial Reception has grown each year and is now a favorite legal and social highlight in October in downtown Tallahassee.

1998 was the first time that TWL sought sponsorships to defray the cost of the event. Since then, many law firms, businesses and individuals have generously sponsored Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze level donations each year making it one of TWL's most successful events.

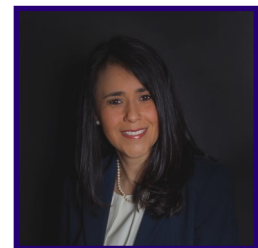
SPREAD SOME SUNSHINE!

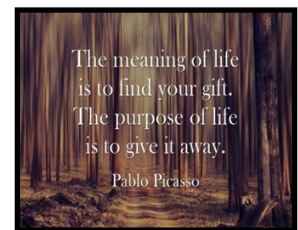
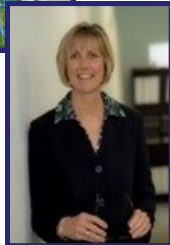

September Meeting: Combating Human Trafficking

Professor Coonan is a nationally recognized human rights advocate and known for his work in combating human trafficking. In addition to Professor Coonan's work at FSU Law, he has also worked at the Department of Justice, litigated asylum and immigration cases nationwide, and has worked on various United Nations human rights projects.

In 2013, Professor Coonan was invited to the White House to

advise the Obama Administration of best practices in combating human trafficking. Most recently he was appointed by Attorney General Pam Bondi to serve on the Florida Statewide Council on Human Trafficking.

Professor Coonan will address human trafficking issues in Florida, a state which is currently a top destination for the trafficking of prostitutes and laborers.

In the past few years, Federal prosecutors throughout the

state have identified hundreds of victims of human trafficking, including a significant number of cases of "domestic servitude." Professor Coonan will speak about these current topics in human trafficking, including its prevalence throughout North Florida as well as the current laws and other legislation in place in Florida that address the issue of human trafficking. He will also address current efforts to combat this problem.

I have attended educational and informative meetings on a variety of topics, have participated in the Tallahassee Bar Association’s chili cook-off and assisted with Jazz for Justice, benefiting Legal Services of North Florida, and have spoken with our state representatives and senators about legis-

lation. TWL is a local chapter of the Florida Association for Women Lawyers (“FAWL”). Through my involvement with TWL, I have become active in FAWL and have had the opportunity to meet lawyers throughout the state. I wish the same opportunities for you.

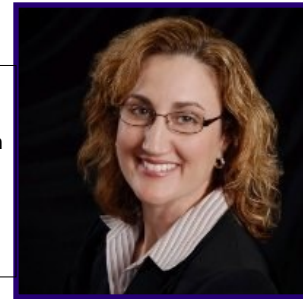

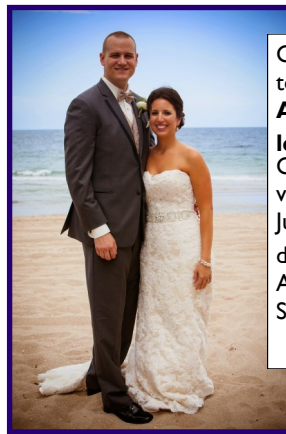

It's a new academic year and that means it is time to sign up to be a mentor to an FSU law student. TWL has a long-standing mentoring program operated in conjunction with the FSU Women's Law Symposium (WLS). Acting as a mentor is a great opportunity to give back, to share the wisdom you have gained, and to support and encourage law students.

Students self-identify with WLS to participate in the program. Generally, mentees are 1L students, but upper level students may also participate. Some students continue the relationship with their mentors for all three years of law school.

The time commitment and mentoring experience varies depending on the attorney and the student. I took one student to lunch, received a very formal thank you card and that was the total relationship. In

another year, I had many interactions with my mentee, including going to the hospital with her during the semester break when she thought she was in premature labor.
